EDITOR'S CORNER

A Hero Passes—Bob Brown's father passed away recently at the age of 94. He was one of the last of the Greatest Generation—those men and women who fought in World War II. He was one of the brave men who flew B-24 Liberator bombers which flew from bases in England to bomb the Ploesti oil fields in Romania in 1942 and 1943. Ploesti was the prime source of oil and gasoline for Hitler's Nazi war machine. The Liberators through multiple raids left Ploesti a blazing inferno, cutting off hydrocarbons to the Nazis—but at what a cost. The chances of a plane and aircrew surviving the 25 missions in order to be rotated stateside were very slim. Often, an aircrew may only survive 8 to 10 missions before being shot down by Nazi aircraft or anti-aircraft fire. The guts it took for our men to climb aboard those flying coffins for a mission in which they could die requires a bravery that few of us can comprehend 75+ years later. Could we be so brave today if faced with such adversity? Because of men like Bob's father, we haven't had to.

BRRR—!2 degrees above zero at our house on the morning of January17 kept your fiendly editor and Judy in the house, and out of the garage. As a result, the cars stored there received little love and care. We hope the weather warms up a little so that they may again brought out of the shadows into the sun. Saturday, the day of the Car Show at the Gillespie County fair grounds started out a bit windy and drizzly west of Hwy. 281, but in the afternoon, the temperatures warmed up, and a warm breeze out of the south made things pleasant as we viewed the cars. 
