LAKE AREA RODS & CLASSICS HOW IT ALL BEGAN A SHORT HISTORY

Way back in the Spring of 2004, a group of people who fancy old cars of any kind – even those who were sort of newish, got together and had an idea. It may have begun with a thought like this: "Let's get together and form a club for folks who just generally like cars that have character, regardless of brand. There doesn't have to be any cut off of a car's year, and it could be a shiny custom, a rat rod, a classic, or just interesting, and the owner(s) could be a man or a woman".

The line of thought could have also included something like – "Let's band together as a group of folks who like cars and like to hang out together and do things together. Let's go to dinner together, have a monthly meeting, go places as a group with our special cars. Let's go to car shows so we can shine them up and let other people share our joy over our chariots. Let's be of service to our community! Let's just go have fun with each other!"

With this nucleus, a group of folks got together at Don and Cleora's house on April 21, 2004. They were Don and Cleora, Mike Dohrse, Pete Bundrant, and Pat Bullard. Mike, Don, and Cleora had the idea to have this get together, and Mike kicked the proceedings off, and kept the meeting focused as presider. They kicked the idea of a car club around and agreed to meet in early May, after spreading the word around among their friends who fancy unique cars, about a get together.

n early May, folks got together again at Don and Cleora's house to put together a combined club Constitution and By Laws. This was the first of 3 or 4 intensive get togethers to hammer out these documents. Tasked with this job were: Don and Cleora, Pete and Paula Bundrant, Mike Dohrse, Stan and Sharon Zimberg, John Rex, and Pat Bullard. The hammer work was done during these meetings.

As a result, Article 2 of the proposed combined By Laws and Constitution stated the true purpose of the Club:

"The purpose of the Organization shall be to establish an association of members for the purpose of encouraging restoration, preservation, and building of classic cars, trucks, and street rods. Other purposes of the organization shall be encouraging participation in community services, socializing, and providing enjoyment for all members".

On May 25, approximately 30 or 40 car fanciers met at **the Senior Citizen's Community Center** in Burnet, and in this organizational meeting, they put together a group of folks that would be willing to serve on a Board of Directors. Several people volunteered to serve and the proposed slate of officers consisted of:

Stan Zimberg- President
John Rex – Vice President
Cleora Craw – Treasurer
Paula Bundrant - Secretary
Mike Dohrse – Co-Activity Director
Billy Hutson – Co-Activity Director

The folks agreed to hold another meeting in June to formally approve the slate of officers, and approve the proposed By Laws-Constitution.

On June 3, 2004, Cleora Craw published the club's first newsletter – **Volume 1, Issue 1**, with the headline"

"NEW CAR CLUB IN TOWN!"

This spread the news that the germ of an idea was coming into fruition.

As a result, in early June, a new car club was born at a meeting at the Senior Citizen's Community Center, with forty to fifty people in attendance, and at this meeting:

The slate of **Officers** was approved by acclamation

The By Laws-Constitution was approved

The name Lake Area Rods and Classics was adopted

The Club Logo was adopted

Club Clothing (T-shirts, polo shirts, blue denim, long sleeve shirts, and hats) was adopted.

John Rex, who had great artistic talent, spent many hours **designing the beautiful logo** we now use. [Editor's Note: The logo of the Lake Area Rods and Classics is copyrighted as of 2004 and cannot be used or reproduced in any way without the specific written approval of the Club Officers].

In addition, Cleora Craw and Shirley Bullard did heroic work, wading through endless swamps of bureaucracy and red tape to gain a 501C7 tax exempt status as a non-profit, tax-exempt social club – no mean feat, since these ladies did it on their own time, without a penny's compensation for all the blood, sweat, and tears it took to put it all together.

A new club was born and formalized, and as a celebration, the members decided to get together and hold a **Progressive Dinner** on June 13. This was the **Club's First Activity**, and 46 members in 23 cars were in attendance. This was 2/3 of the entire membership that got together for the first organizational outing. **Appetizers and salads** were hosted by **Don and Cleora Craw**. Next, the members in their 23 cars had a caravan en route to **dinner** hosted by **John and Patty Rex**. Since one of our members Mike Martin, was a Sergeant of the Burnet Police Department, a police escort, complete with red and blue lights and the privilege of running red lights, was facilitated. This was probably the first time that these hot-rodders didn't get a ticket for running a red – maybe 2, 3, 4, or 5? Following the dinner, another caravan was formed, for **dessert** was hosted at the house of **Mike and Norma Jean Dohrse** on the west shore of Lake Buchanan. [*Editor's Note: No record exists to document the speeds that were attained on Hwy 29 west of Burnet on the way to the Dohrse's! Anyway, ain't no one talking about it, so the speeds attained remain buried in secrecy!*

Well folks, that's how it all began – 13 years ago. **Now in 2017, we have over 143 members as of the March Minutes!** As more of the history becomes available, more will follow in subsequent issues of our Newsletter. This becomes important, since we have so many new members who aren't aware how this vital organization came to be, and some of our original members have already gone to the Great Car Show in Heaven. Our club has a wealth of information archived by those who put so much work in getting this lashup off the ground, and this history is too precious to be lost.

The information garnered for this first installment on the Club's history resulted from a Sunday, Feb. 26, 2017 meeting at Mike Dohrse's beautiful house and compound on the west side of Lake Buchanan. This meeting consisted of Founding Members Mike Dohrse, and Don Craw, and your Friendly Editor – a relative newcomer. The meeting took well over two hours and Norma Jean as Hostess makes a delicious cup of coffee. Norma Jean took Judy in hand and they toured the Dohrse compound. During this two hour meeting, Mike and Don laid out the history of the Club's birth, and was reinforced by correspondence, and the privilege of being able to see the first issue of the Newsletter – Vol. 1, Issue 1. This collection of newsletters survives only due to the efforts of folks dedicated to keeping the legacy and history of the club alive.

We hope that more aspects of the club's early history and activities can be explored from time to time, and published in future issues of the Newsletter. Stay tuned.


