June 1 - Saturday - **Cruise to the Cherokee Home for Children** - I have talked to Delton McGuire, their Executive Director, and he told me the Staff and particularly the kids are anxiously awaiting our return. I met with Delton recently at the Home. Right now they are almost 100% full. With 17 girls and 11 boys. All but 2 are teenagers. For those who have not been there, it is one of the most rewarding experiences you can have. There are many reasons these children are in the HOME, and none of them good. We provide a reason for them to smile. We do this by interacting with the kids and providing them with RIDES. The Home provides us with Doughnuts and Coffee, as well as, lunch. We provide role models, cars and rides. These are some of the best mannered kids you will ever see. They look at the cars with their hands behind their backs. Last time we went we had 17 cars and 34 members. We have done this five times and I have not had anyone say anything but how genuinely good they feel after the experience. You know when you leave you have done some good. We will caravan from Fuzzy's Corner, leaving @ 9:30AM, arriving at the Home @ 10:00AM.

June 15 - Saturday - Burnet County Area Fair - I was contacted by Connie Roark, the Chair of the Burnet County Area Fair Committee and she asked for our support by displaying our cars, (15-20) much the same as we did for The Bertram Old Fashioned Christmas . It would be from 10:00AM -4:00PM. They see us as a huge drawing card and are very appreciative of our presence at the Fair. They asked me to do a Bio and Pictures on the Club which they are going to include in their Catalogue and their advertising. I mentioned that we are an IRS 501-c7 and she said so were they. 
